PE and Sport Premium was introduced in March 2013 to improve the provision of Physical Education and school sport in primary schools across England. The Government committed to this funding until further notice and is reviewed on a yearly basis.

Christ the King RC Primary School is committed to providing a high quality, broad and balanced curriculum.

Sports Premium funding seeks to support provision of Physical Education and Sport to enable wider curricular opportunities, therefore our funding is used to improve mental wellbeing, attainment and progress of pupils.

Sports Premium allows us to strengthen the quality of our PE Lessons and widen the opportunities available to children in lessons and during playtime. The additional and sustainable improvements to our provision help benefit all our pupils to encourage them to develop healthy and active lifestyles.

We monitor the efficiency and effectiveness of Sports Premium on a regular basis through assessments, attendance reports for our extra-curricular clubs and the Children's University. These facilitate a cohesive measure for both uptake of clubs, experiences and fitness levels.

Our key objectives are:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport.
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

We pride ourselves on the sports and PE provision we offer our children at Christ the King. For 2023 / 2024 we gained the **Platinum Award** for the School Games Mark, this recognises our commitment to the development of competition at our school and 5 consecutive years of gaining the gold award.

- Provide extra additional activities such as outdoor and adventurous orienteering.
- Provide high quality training.
- Buy into further sports coaching initiatives, providing regular sports tournaments, festivals and competitions.

Updates relating to our provision for PE and Sport will be provided throughout the academic year through social media, newsletters and letters home. The provision and experiences we offer to the children will be closely monitored, evaluated and reported back to the governors on a termly basis.

SWIMMING AND WATER SAFETY

Swimming is an important skill and can encourage a healthy and active lifestyle. As part of the National Curriculum we ensure that all children who leave Christ the King can swim at least 25 metres. We offer swimming to all our pupils in KS2.

In our current Year 6 class, 100% of pupils are able to swim at least 25 metres. Progress will be monitored closely for all our KS2 classes to ensure we receive the same result every year.
